

Sonja S. Keating is the Executive Vice-President and General Counsel for the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF), the national governing body for equestrian sport. She has served the organization for 12 ½ years. She advises the Chief Executive Officer, Senior Staff, and Board of Directors on all legal matters. Such matters include corporate governance, procedures for selection of equine and human athletes to international competitions, commercial disputes involving athletes and/or sponsors, contracts, legislative and rule changes. She also handles athlete grievances, acts as prosecutor before the Hearing Committee on disciplinary matters, manages all litigation, and works closely with the USEF Equine Drugs & Medications Program and Equine Research and Drug Testing Laboratory, which is owned by USEF.

Ms. Keating served on the USOC SafeSport NGB Task Force aimed at developing harmonious standards among the national governing bodies to address sexual misconduct and related misconduct in sport, which led to the recommendation for minimum standards for all USOC member organizations. She also served on the USOC Safe Sport Working Group, which collaborated with the USOC on the policies and procedures for the U.S. Center for SafeSport.

Keating earned a B.A. from Transylvania University and a law degree from the University of Kentucky. Prior to joining USEF, Keating practiced in the litigation department at Dinsmore & Shohl.
